Frequently Asked Questions About the Epiphany! Book Study

What is Epiphany?

As defined in the Oxford dictionary, Epiphany is the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi (Matthew 2:1–12).

When does the Epiphany! book study start at St. Paul's?
