ANCIENT AND MODERN WORSHIP

Whether you have been attending St. Paul's for years or this is your first time, we are glad you are here! We hope you'll feel God in this place. In our church, all baptized Christians are invited to receive Holy Communion regardless of age or denomination. If you have not been baptized but would like to receive a blessing, just cross your arms over your chest when you come to the Altar Rail and the priest will know that you'd like to be blessed. If you would like to hear more from us or learn about getting connected, please fill out a visitor card that can be found in the pews and place it in the offering plate.

The Nursery is open for children six weeks to 5 years old. Our trained nursery staff provide a safe, caring, and nurturing environment for your children. The Nursery is through the doors at right side of the Nave (worship space). Children's Church is a liturgical worship experience especially for children ages 3 ½ through 8. It is located upstairs, just off the elevator. An usher will be happy to help you find your way! Children are also more than welcome to remain for the entire service. Feel free to decide what works best for your family.

If you are new to the Episcopal Church, you may find parts of the service unfamiliar – that is perfectly fine! Many of us did not grow up in this tradition but were drawn to the way that our worship feels ancient and yet still relevant today. Everything you need for the service is in this bulletin. You'll notice that we draw from the Book of Common Prayer (BCP) and Hymnal. These are found in the pew rack and you're welcome to use them!

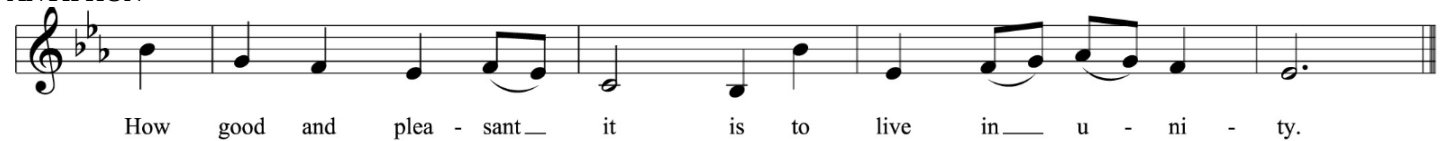

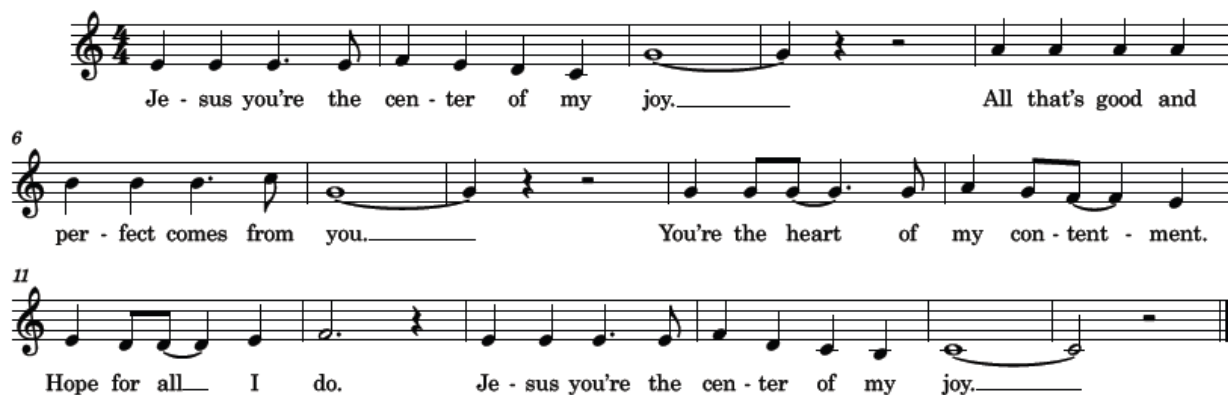
